Regulations of the Site and Mass Event
DREAMERSLAND 2023

Taking place at the Babie Lato Center in Ziemiary.

REGULATIONS OF THE SITE AND MASS EVENT called "DREAMERSLAND 2023" taking place from August 3, 2023 to August 6, 2023 on the site designated by the Event Organizer in Ziemiary at the Babie Lato Center.

GENERAL PROVISIONS.

1. This regulation (hereinafter referred to as the "Regulation") has been issued on the basis of the provisions of the Act of 20 March 2009 on safety of mass events (Journal of Laws of 2022, item 1466, 1700), hereinafter referred to as the "Act".
2. The Regulation has been issued by the Organizer of the event, DREAMERSLAND Sp. z o.o. (hereinafter referred to as the "Organizer").
3. The Regulation is addressed to all persons who will be present on the premises where the Mass Event is held during its duration. Every person present on the premises during the Mass Event is obliged to comply with the provisions of this Regulation.
4. The Regulation specifies the conditions of participation and rules of conduct for participants of the mass event, including in particular provisions regulating:
 - participants' duties;
 - conditions of participation;
 - participants' rights;
 - participants' liability for non-compliance with the regulation.
5. The following definitions used in the Regulation shall have the following meaning:
 - "Order Services" and "Information Services" - shall mean the persons appointed by the Organizer, including employees of security agencies, who carry an ID card, to ensure the safety of persons participating in the Mass Event, in accordance with the rights and obligations resulting from the currently applicable law. Members of the Order and Information Services have identification cards placed in a visible place containing: the name of the exhibitor, an identification number, a seal and a signature of the exhibitor, name and surname, and a facial image.
 - "Mass Event Area" - means the designated area where the Event is held, from the moment of verifying the entitlements allowing access to the Mass Event Area. The duration of the Mass Event is considered the period from the

moment the facility is made available to participants until the last participant leaves the facility.

- "Participant of the Event" - means any person participating in the Mass Event.

TERMS OF PARTICIPATION IN A MASS EVENT.

1. Admission to the Mass Event Venue is free of charge.
2. Hours of the Mass Event:
 - 03.08 - from 4:00 p.m. to 3:00 a.m.
 - 04.08 - from 4:00 p.m. to 3:00 a.m.
 - 05.08 - from 4:00 p.m. to 3:00 a.m.
1. It is prohibited to admit to the Mass Event:
 - Persons who have been issued a ban on entering a mass event or who are obliged to refrain from staying in places where mass events are held, issued by a court against a convicted person in connection with a suspended sentence of imprisonment or against a minor under Art. 6 point 2 of the Act of 26 October 1982 on proceedings in juvenile cases, as well as persons against whom a foreign or club ban has been issued;
 - Persons who refuse to undergo the activities specified in Art. 20 of the Act on the safety of mass events;
 - Persons under the visible influence of alcohol, intoxicants, psychotropic substances or other similar substances;
 - Persons who possess weapons or other dangerous objects, explosive materials, pyrotechnic products, fire-hazardous materials, intoxicants or psychotropic substances, and alcoholic beverages;
 - Persons who behave aggressively, provocatively, or in any other way pose a threat to public safety or order;
 - Persons using clothing elements that make it difficult to identify the participant.
2. The assessment of objects and their qualification as dangerous belongs to the Security and Information Services.
3. The Organizer of the Event may refuse admission to the Mass Event and the stay on it to persons:
 - possessing objects recognized as dangerous;
 - violating the prohibitions contained in this Regulation.
4. During the Mass Event, in particular, it is forbidden to:
 - use clothing or objects to cover the face in order to prevent or hinder identification;
 - proclaiming and displaying slogans of an obscene, xenophobic, vulgar and racist nature, inciting disputes on the basis of nationality, religion, social status, etc.;
 - allowing viewers to enter places not intended for event participants, including entering other installations located at the event venue (fencing, fences, lamps, stage area, technical point with a console);
 - throwing objects;
 - possession and consumption of alcohol;
 - possession and use of intoxicants or psychotropic substances or other similarly acting substances;

- lighting and stoking fires;
 - possession of explosive materials, pyrotechnic products, and substances with similar effects;
 - fulfilling physiological needs outside toilets and littering the event venue, as well as destroying infrastructure;
 - unjustified occupation of places in communication lines and in the area of evacuation routes.
5. It is forbidden to bring and possess at the Mass Event:
- weapons, ammunition and other dangerous items that can be used as dangerous items threatening the lives or health of participants in a mass event;
 - explosive materials, pyrotechnic products, and substances with similar effects and all kinds of fire-hazardous materials;
 - containers for liquids or food products made of hard materials, including plastic bottles;
 - helmets, umbrellas with sharp tips, etc.
 - containers for spraying gas, corrosive or coloring substances,
 - horns, trumpets, and instruments with mechanical or electrical drive,
 - laser pointers,
 - promotional materials except those allowed with the written consent of the Organizer,
 - cameras and photographic equipment, as well as other devices recording sound or image, except those intended for strictly private use, and devices used to transmit images, sounds, descriptions of events via the Internet or other forms of communication.
 - It is not allowed to bring tripods, and photos must be taken for private purposes. You should take photos in a way that does not limit anyone's view on the audience nor disturb people standing nearby. These restrictions do not apply to persons with press accreditation and other persons allowed with the written consent of the Organizer.
 - The entry of animals is prohibited, except for guide dogs.
 - The entry of banners or flags is prohibited.
6. It is prohibited to enter areas not intended for the public. This ban applies in particular to: stages, buildings and equipment not intended for public use, lighting equipment, trees, all kinds of masts, poles, and entrances to other places: equipment and rooms accessible only to specialized services or representatives of the event Organizer.

RIGHTS AND OBLIGATIONS OF PARTICIPANTS OF AN EVENT.

1. The participant of a mass event has the right to:
- stay on the premises of the mass event from the moment the venue is made available by the Organizer until the end of the mass event.
 - receive information about the location of medical, information, and sanitation points, as well as the safety requirements established by the Organizer,

- use the facilities, including the hygienic-sanitary facilities, which are made available for general use, in accordance with their intended purpose,
 - use medical assistance on the premises of the mass event,
 - report to the Organizer any information and claims regarding damages suffered by the participant during the mass event.
2. The participant of a mass event is obliged to:
- comply with the instructions of the Security and Information Services, including the safety manager. Refusal to comply with these instructions may only be due to their contradiction with universally applicable laws,
 - not disturb public order,
 - comply with the provisions of this Regulation,
 - not pose a threat to the safety of other persons present on the premises of the mass event,
 - comply with the orders and instructions of the Organizer's services, the speaker, and in the event of intervention by police officers, firefighters, or other authorized authorities, to comply with their orders.

PENAL PROVISIONS ARISING FROM THE ACT

1. Failure to comply with this Regulation may result in criminal liability under the provisions of the Act on Mass Events Safety, in particular:
- Art. 54. 1. Whoever does not comply with the order given on the basis of the Act, the facility (area) regulations or the mass event regulations by the order services or information services, shall be subject to a penalty of restriction of liberty or a fine of not less than PLN 2,000.
2. The same penalty applies to anyone who, during the mass event:
- a) stays in a place not intended for the public;
 - b) attends a mass sports event in a sector other than the one indicated on the admission ticket or other document entitling to attend the mass event and does not leave that sector despite being called upon by the authorized person.
- Art. 55. Anyone who fails to comply with an order issued by the Police or the Military Gendarmerie, at the place and during the mass event, shall be subject to a penalty of restriction of liberty or a fine of not less than PLN 2,000.
 - Art. 56. Anyone who, contrary to the provisions of the Act, brings or possesses alcoholic beverages at a mass event, shall be subject to a penalty of restriction of liberty or a fine of not less than PLN 2,000.
 - Art. 57a. Anyone who, at the place and during the mass sports event, uses an element of clothing or an object to prevent or significantly hinder the identification of a person, shall be subject to a penalty of restriction of liberty or a fine of not less than PLN 2,000;
 - Art. 59. 1. Anyone who brings or possesses weapons, within the meaning of the Act of May 21, 1999, on weapons and ammunition (Journal of Laws of

2022, item 2516), pyrotechnic products, fire hazardous materials or other dangerous items or explosive materials at a mass event, shall be subject to a fine of not less than 220 daily rates, restriction of liberty or deprivation of liberty for a period of 3 months to 5 years.

3. The court may order the forfeiture of items referred to in paragraph 1, even if they do not belong to the offender.

FINAL PROVISIONS

1. Persons who disrupt public order or behave contrary to the Mass Event Regulations in accordance with the provisions of the Act shall be removed from the Mass Event area or handed over to the Police.
2. Persons who have been denied admission or removed from the Mass Event area due to a violation of the Mass Event Regulations or the Act are not entitled to compensation.
3. All rights to the name and logo of the Mass Event are reserved for the Organizer.
4. It is prohibited to conduct any commercial or other profitable activity, as well as advertising or promotional activities on the Mass Event area without the Organizer's authorization.
5. The Organizer may record the course of the Mass Event for documentation and promotion or advertising of the Event and events in future years by and for the Organizer and sponsors. Entry to the event area constitutes the Participant's simultaneous consent to the use of their image in connection with the production, presentation, advertising or use of film, video and audio recordings from the Mass Event in media broadcasts worldwide.
6. This Regulation is available:
 - on the website www.dreamersland.eu
 - at information points and at entrances to the Mass Event area, on the Organizer's social media portals.
7. The Regulation comes into force on August 3, 2023, at 4:00 p.m. and ceases to be in force after the end of the Mass Event on August 6, 2023, at 3:00 a.m.
