

MASS EVENT REGULATIONS

Regulations of the Festival Grounds and Mass Event

DREAMERSLAND 2025

Taking place at "Babie Lato" in Ziemiarz.

REGULATIONS FOR THE AREA AND MASS EVENT titled "DREAMERSLAND 2025" taking place from July 10th, 2025 to July 14th, 2025, at the location designated by the Event Organizer in Ziemiarz, at the "Babie Lato" Center.**

GENERAL PROVISIONS

1. These regulations (hereinafter referred to as the "Regulations") are issued pursuant to the provisions of the Act of March 20, 2009, on the safety of mass events (consolidated text: Journal of Laws of 2022, item 1466, 1700), hereinafter referred to as the "Act."
2. The Regulations are issued by the Organizer of the event, i.e., DREAMERSLAND Sp. z o.o. (hereinafter referred to as the "Organizer").
3. The Regulations are addressed to all persons who will be present at the venue during the mass event. Each person present in this area during the event is required to comply with the provisions of these Regulations.
4. The Regulations define the conditions of participation and the rules of conduct for participants in the mass event, including, in particular, provisions governing:
 - the obligations of the event participants;
 - the conditions of participation;
 - the rights of participants of the mass event;
 - the responsibility of participants for conduct that does not comply with the regulations.
5. The following terms used in the Regulations shall have the following meanings:
 - "Security Services" and "Information Services" – refer to persons appointed by the Organizer, including employees of personal and property protection agencies, identifiable by badges, to ensure the safety of persons participating in the Mass Event, in accordance with their powers and obligations under applicable law. Members of the Security and Information Services carry visible identification containing: the

issuer's name, identification number, seal and signature of the issuer, first and last name, and facial image.

- "Mass Event Area" – refers to the designated area where the Event is conducted, from the moment of verification of the rights that form the basis for admission to the Mass Event Area. The time of the Mass Event is considered to be the period from the moment the facility is made available to participants until the departure of the last participant from the facility.
- "Event Participant" – means any person participating in the Mass Event.

CONDITIONS OF PARTICIPATION IN THE MASS EVENT

1. Admission to the Mass Event Area is free with a purchased ticket for the Dreamersland Festival 2025.

2. Mass Event Hours:

July 10: 16:00 - 3:00

July 11: 16:00 - 3:00

July 12: 16:00 - 3:00

July 13: 16:00 - 3:00

Detailed Provisions:

1. Entry to the Mass Event is prohibited for any person:
 - who is subject to a court order prohibiting entry to mass events or requiring them to refrain from staying in places where mass events are held, issued in connection with a conditional suspension of the execution of a prison sentence or against a minor under Article 6 point 2 of the Act of October 26, 1982, on proceedings in juvenile cases, as well as individuals who are subject to a foreign or club ban;
 - who refuses to submit to the actions specified in Article 20 of the Act on the Safety of Mass Events;
 - who is visibly under the influence of alcohol, drugs, psychotropic substances, or other similarly acting substances;
 - who possesses weapons or other dangerous objects, explosives, pyrotechnic articles, flammable materials, intoxicants, or psychotropic substances, as well as alcoholic beverages;
 - who behaves aggressively, provocatively, or in any way that poses a threat to public safety or order;
 - who uses clothing items that hinder the identification of a participant.

2. The Event Organizer may refuse entry to the Mass Event and the presence of individuals:
 - possessing items deemed dangerous;

- violating the prohibitions contained in these Regulations.
3. During the Mass Event, it is strictly prohibited to:
- use clothing items or objects to cover the face to prevent or hinder identification;
 - display or post slogans with obscene, xenophobic, vulgar, or racist content, or incite hostility based on nationality, religion, or social status;
 - enter areas not intended for participants, including climbing onto other installations located in the event area (fences, barriers, lights, stage area, technical point with a console);
 - throw objects;
 - possess and consume alcohol;
 - possess and use narcotics or psychotropic substances or other similarly acting substances;
 - ignite or fuel fires;
 - possess explosives, pyrotechnic products, or substances with similar effects;
 - relieve oneself outside the toilets, litter the event area, or damage the infrastructure;
 - occupy places unnecessarily in communication routes and evacuation areas.
4. It is forbidden to bring or possess the following at the Mass Event:
- weapons, ammunition, and other dangerous objects that may be used as dangerous items posing a threat to life or health;
 - explosives, pyrotechnic products, substances with similar effects, and any kind of flammable materials;
 - containers for liquids or food made of hard material, including plastic bottles;
 - helmets, umbrellas with sharp ends;
 - gas sprays, corrosive or dye substances;
 - trumpets, vuvuzelas, and mechanically or electrically powered instruments;
 - laser pointers;
 - promotional materials, except those permitted with the written consent of the Organizer;
 - cameras, photographic equipment, and other devices for recording sound or image, except those for strictly private use, as well as devices for transmitting images, sound, or event descriptions via the Internet or other forms of communication;
 - bringing tripods is prohibited, and photographs must be taken for private purposes only. Photos should be taken in a way that does not restrict the field of view for anyone in the audience or disturb those nearby. These restrictions do not apply to persons with press accreditation and others permitted with the written consent of the Organizer;
 - bringing animals, except for guide dogs;
 - carrying banners or flags.

5. Entering areas not intended for the public is prohibited. This prohibition applies in particular to: stages, buildings, and equipment not intended for public use, lighting equipment, trees, all types of masts, poles, and entering other places: equipment and rooms to which only specialist services or representatives of the event organizer have access.

PRAWA I OBOWIĄZKI UCZESTNIKÓW IMPREZY

1. The participant of a mass event has the right to:
 - Remain on the event premises from the moment the venue is opened by the organizer until the event concludes.
 - Receive information about the locations of medical points, information desks, sanitary facilities, and amenities, as well as safety requirements set by the organizer.
 - Use the facilities, including hygiene and sanitary amenities, provided for general use, in accordance with their intended purpose.
 - Access medical assistance within the event premises.
 - Report to the organizer any information and potential claims regarding damages incurred during the event.
2. The participant of a mass event is required to:
 - Follow the instructions of the security and information staff, including the safety manager. Refusal to comply with these instructions may only occur if they conflict with generally applicable laws.
 - Not disturb public order.
 - Adhere to the provisions of the event regulations.
 - Not endanger the safety of other individuals present at the event.
 - Comply with the orders and instructions of the organizer's staff, the announcer, and, in case of intervention, follow the directions of the police, fire service, or other authorized authorities.
 - Abide by the rules applicable in the Bolimów Landscape Park, particularly respecting the natural environment, maintaining order, and caring for ecology.

Criminal Provisions Resulting from the Act

1. Failure to comply with these regulations may result in criminal liability under the provisions of the Act on the Safety of Mass Events, including, in particular:
 - Article 54. 1. Anyone who fails to comply with a directive issued by security or information services based on the law, venue regulations, or mass event regulations is subject to a penalty of restriction of freedom or a fine of no less than PLN 2,000.
2. The same penalty applies to anyone who, during the mass event:
 - a) Stays in an area not designated for the public;

- b) At a mass sports event, remains in a sector other than the one specified on their admission ticket or other valid document and does not leave that sector despite being requested to do so by an authorized person.
- **Article 55.** Anyone who fails to comply with a directive issued by the Police or Military Gendarmerie at the location and during the time of a mass event is subject to a penalty of restriction of freedom or a fine of no less than PLN 2,000.
 - **Article 56.** Anyone who, contrary to the provisions of the law, brings or possesses alcoholic beverages at a mass event is subject to a penalty of restriction of freedom or a fine of no less than PLN 2,000.
 - **Article 57a.** Anyone who, at the location and during the time of a mass sports event, uses an item of clothing or object to prevent or significantly hinder the identification of a person is subject to a penalty of restriction of freedom or a fine of no less than PLN 2,000.
 - **Article 59. 1.** Anyone who brings or possesses weapons, as defined by the Act of May 21, 1999, on Weapons and Ammunition, pyrotechnic products, fire hazardous materials, or other dangerous items or explosive materials at a mass event is subject to a fine of no less than 220 daily rates, restriction of freedom, or imprisonment from 3 months to 5 years.

3. The court may order the confiscation of the items referred to in paragraph 1, even if they do not belong to the perpetrator.

Final Provisions

1. Individuals who disrupt public order or behave in violation of the Mass Event Regulations will be removed from the Mass Event premises or handed over to the Police.
2. Individuals who are denied entry or presence, or who are removed from the Mass Event premises due to violations of the Mass Event Regulations or the Act, are not entitled to compensation.
3. All rights to the name and logo of the Mass Event are reserved for the Organizer.
4. Unauthorized commercial or profit-making activities, as well as advertising or promotional activities on the Mass Event premises, are prohibited.
5. The Organizer may record the course of the Mass Event for documentation, promotion, or advertising purposes, for the Organizer and sponsors. Entering the event premises constitutes the participant's consent to the use of their image in connection with the production, presentation, advertising, or use of film, video, and audio recordings from the mass event in media broadcasts worldwide.

7. The Regulation comes into effect on July 10, 2025, at 16:00 and ceases to be in effect after the conclusion of the Mass Event on July 14, 2025, at 03:00.
